



By Virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries bearing date the 11th day of May Anno Dom 1735, Surveyed on the 8th day of April Anno Dom 1736, to Jacob Heestart a Tract of Land in the Township of Hempfield County of Lancaster, Beginning at a post at corner of John Newcomer's Land thence by the land of Hermon Long North 12.3 perches to a Black Oak, thence North 6 deg West 140 per to a Black Oak, thence North West 13 per to a Hickory, thence West South West 250 per to a post, thence South 113^{pt} to a White Oak, thence East 82 per to a White Oak thence South 66 per to a post thence East 168 to the place of Beginning containing three hundred acres with the usual allowance of six p. Genl for Roads &c.
