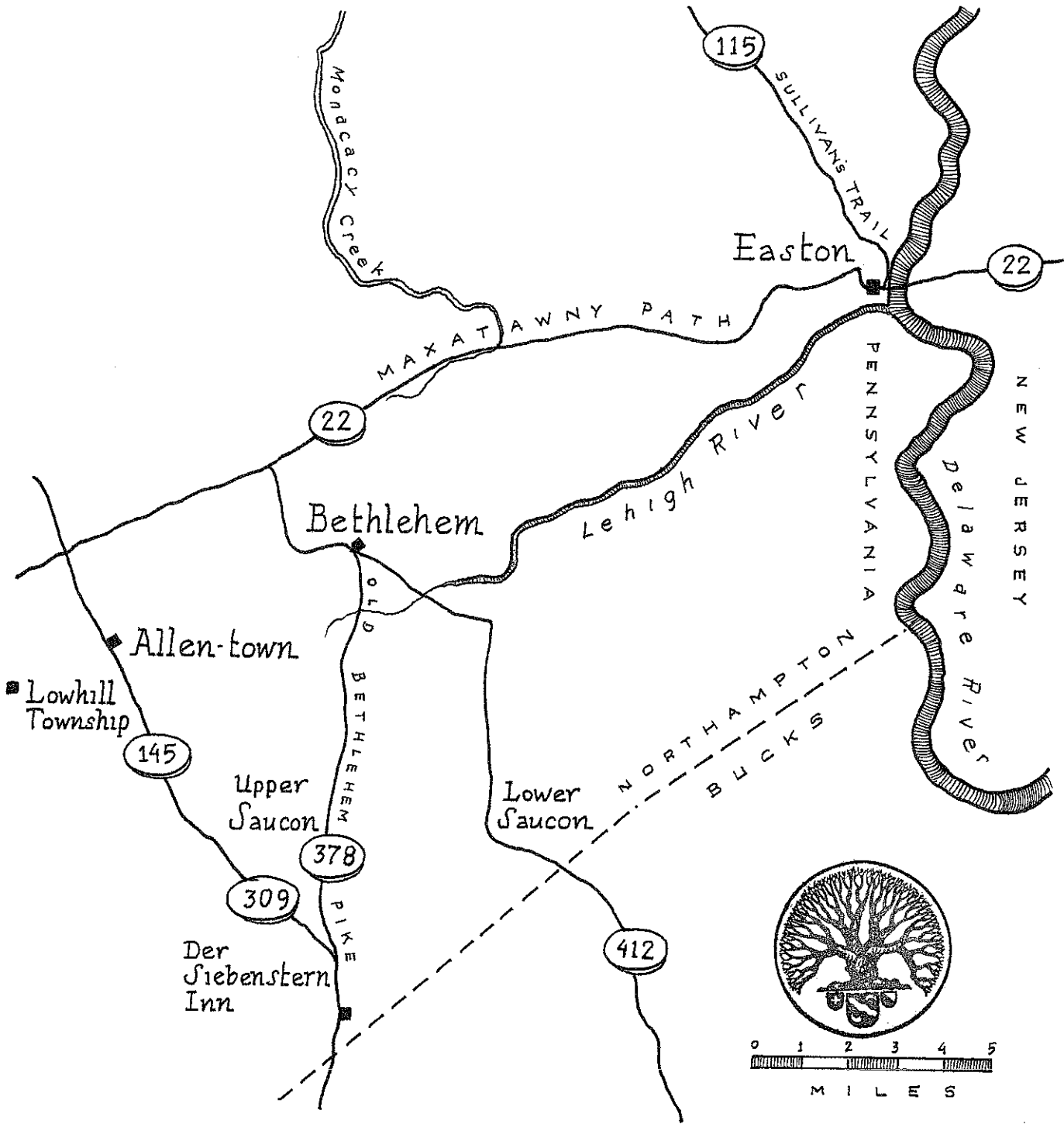

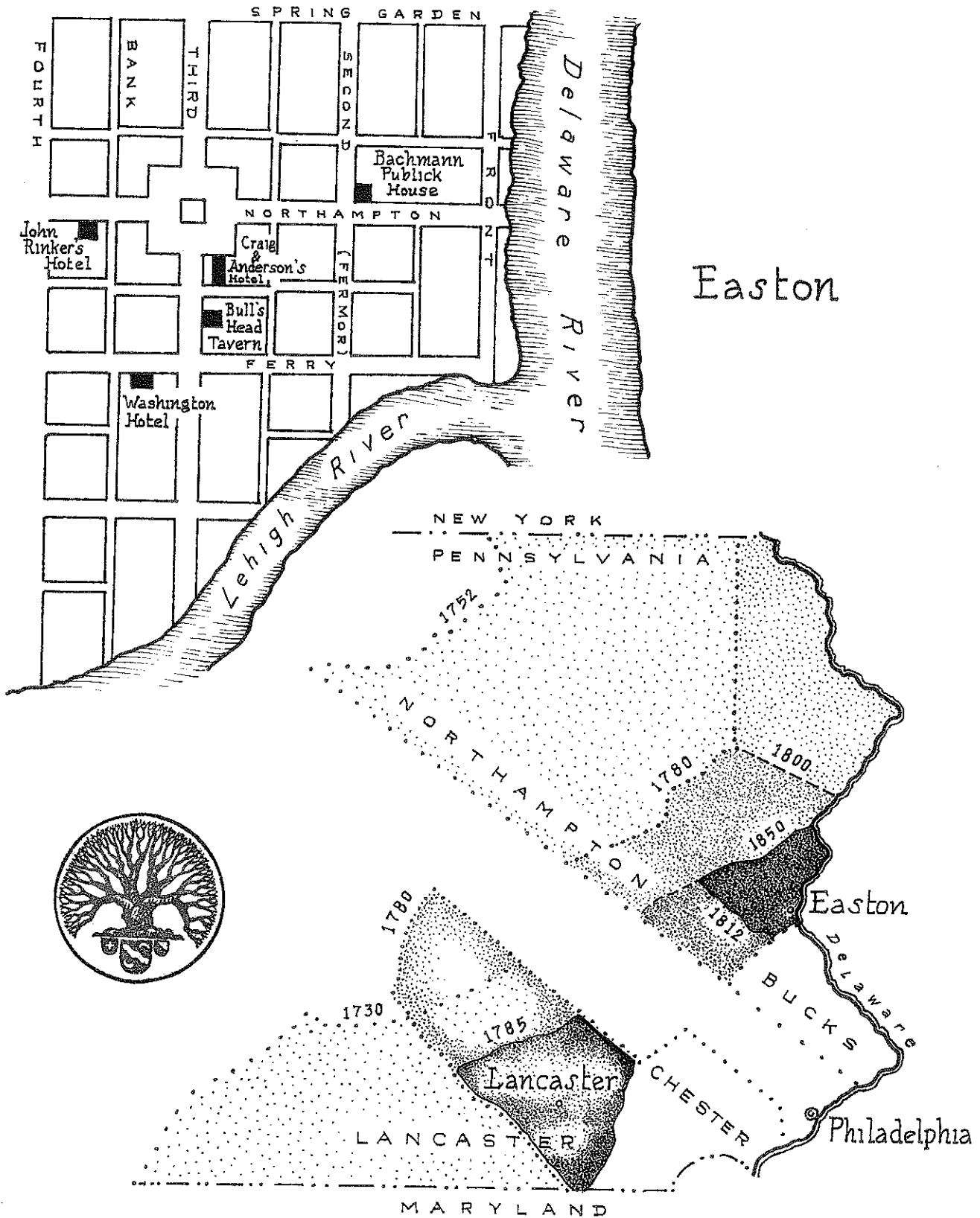

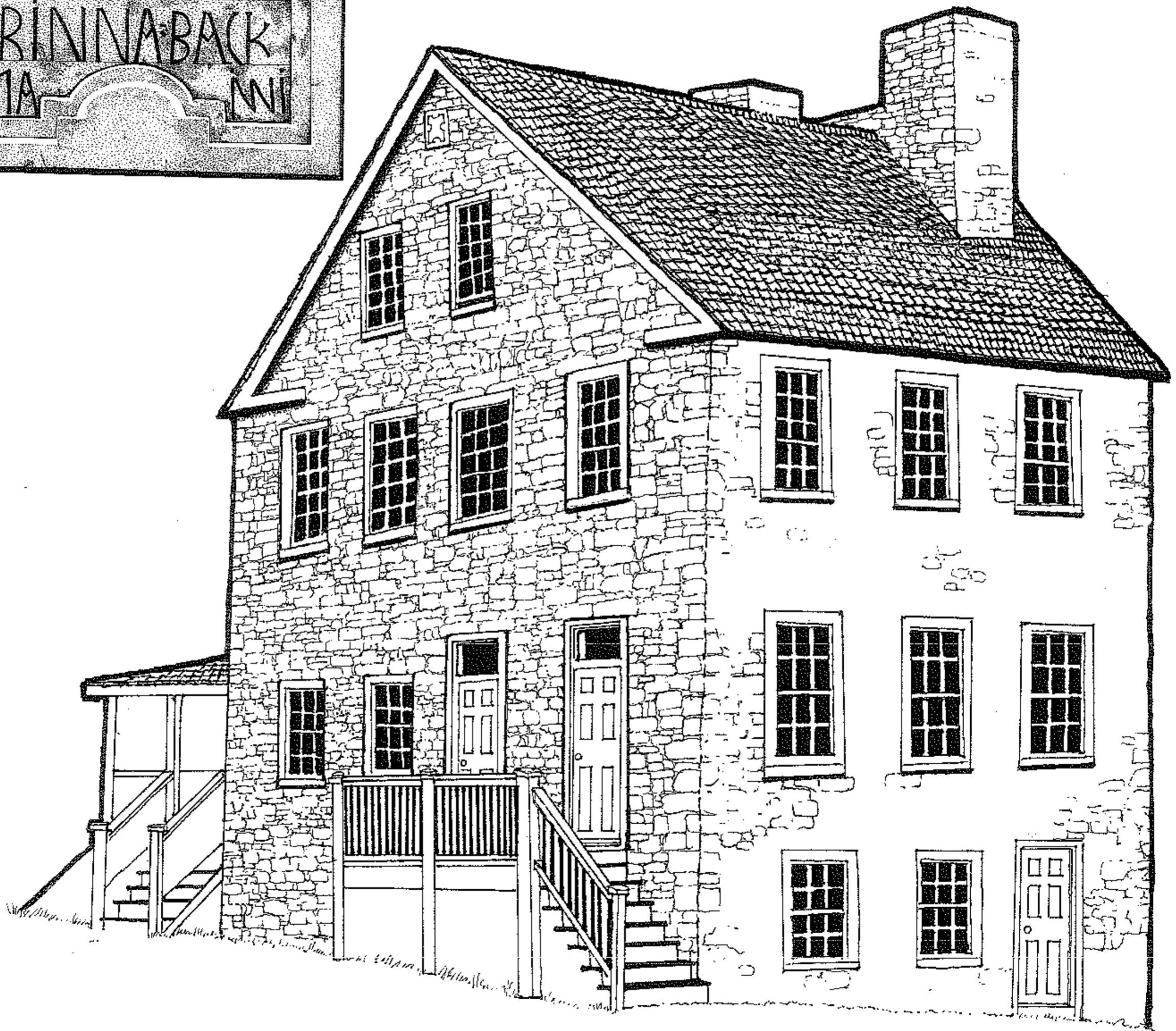
A PART OF HEMPSTEAD TOWNSHIP, AS KNOWN TO THE SWISS AND GERMAN SETTLERS IN 1750
